WILL : le futur simple
(forme affirmative)

Observe :

I **will** represent you. *Je vous représenterai.*

I **will** defend your rights. *Je défendrai vos droits.*

I **'ll** take my responsibilities. *Je prendrai mes responsabilités.*

La règle :

Pour fabriquer le futur simple anglais, on utilise l'auxiliaire modal "**will**" placé avant le verbe. A l'oral en particulier, "**will**" peut se contracter en "**'ll**".

Cas particulier

Je pourrai : I will ~~can~~ -> I will **be able** to (= je serai capable de)

A toi :

Je viendrai -> I

Je serai -> I

Tu réussiras -> You

Il y aura -> There

Nous voterons -> We

WILL : le futur simple

(autres formes)

Forme négative :

I **will not** betray you. *Je ne vous trahirai pas.*

I **won't** let you down. *Je ne vous décevrai pas.*

NB : forme pleine = will not forme contractée = won't

Forme interrogative et réponses courtes :

Will you vote for me ? - Yes, I **will**. *Voterez-vous pour moi ? - Oui.*

Will they respect their promises ? - No, they **won't**. *Respecteront-ils leurs promesses ? - Non.*

Tu ne seras pas -> You

Est-ce que tu essaieras ? -> you ?

Nous ne tolérerons pas -> We

Est-ce qu'ils gagneront ? - Non. -> they ?

BE going to : le futur proche

Observe :

I **am going to** change things ! Je **vais** changer les choses !

We **are going to** win ! Nous **allons** gagner !

Are you **going to** vote for me ? **Allez-vous** voter pour moi ?

La règle :

Comme en français, on peut utiliser le verbe "aller" (GO) pour parler d'un événement prévu dans un futur proche. En anglais, le verbe GO est alors à la forme BE + ing, suivi de la préposition "to".

NB : à l'oral, on peut contracter "going to" en "gonna".

How to make a good speech

Prepare a speech to be elected as a class representative.

It can be serious or funny, you can keep your identity or invent a new one.

1. Greetings : *Hello! – Good morning, my dear classmates – Ladies and gentlemen – Hi, guys! – My fellow students...*

2. Introduce yourself : Name – family – hobbies – interests *Let me introduce myself...*

3. Your qualities to be elected : *respectful, responsible, honest, trustworthy, hard-working, outspoken...*

4. Your proposals for your school, your class: *I promise you that I will ... / I know that you don't like ... / So with me ... / I really want to improve ..., / I definitely want to change ... / If you vote for me, lots of things are going to change, for example ...*

5. Expressions to convince you friends to vote for you: *I promise you that – Let me assure you that - If you vote for me, I will – I really want to do my best – Trust me – You can trust me – I will support you – With me as a representative... you will – My priority is to – The most important for me is to – So, please, do not hesitate- If you need someone you can really trust ...*

6. Thanks: *Thank you – Thank you very much for you attention – thanks for listening...*
